It is out of our "comfort zone." That is why this year's Life Flight/EMS Symposium will focus on common pediatric emergencies presenting in the prehospital setting. These topics and discussions will expand EMS knowledge of pediatric care and management.

- Review how to do a pediatric assessment and discuss trauma scenarios with Andrew Garrett, MD. He will give you effective tools to quickly assess and treat the sick and injured child.
- Mariann Manno, MD, will discuss the "altered adolescent" and the different problems you may encounter.
- What do you do when you have two patients in one? Life Flight Nurse David Derosier, RN, will cover assessment and treatment of the pregnant trauma patient.
- Paramedic James Pelletier will speak about the Safe Harbor Program, the implications for EMS and his personal experiences with our smallest citizens.
- Ricky Kue, MD, talks about what to do when caring for a pediatric drowning victim.
- As EMS professionals we are great at taking care of others, but when a call doesn't turn out as we had hoped, who can we turn to? That is the job of the Critical Incident Stress Management Team. They will discuss how to effectively utilize this exceptional resource.
- Paramedic Ron Gigliotti reviews actual pediatric calls that will test your knowledge and assessment skills. What do you think you would have done?

We are honored to welcome back two former UMass Memorial physicians, Drs. Andrew Garrett and Ricky Kue. They bring with them a wide range of pediatric emergency medicine experiences. It is great to have them here to share their unique perspectives with us.
